## FROM THE PRESIDENT



After our unprecedented success in terms of funds raised in 2021, our efforts in 2022 returned a more normal fundraising experience. Expecting this, we spent the first part of 2022 setting out the policy we would follow for spending the windfall funds obtained in 2021. Our main criteria in this respect were to devise plans for expenditure considering that we make a 10-year commitment to each girl we take into our scholarship program - five years support in junior and senior high school and up to five years of support through university. The Board's decisions in this respect are detailed in the balance of this report.

I am again immensely proud to have played a part in promoting the noble mission of Mujeres en Cambio in 2022. Our very hard-working all-volunteer team have, as always, stepped up to the difficult and critically important challenge of delivering the many elements necessary to continue our scholarship program. In 2022 we had 163 girls and young women in our program from over 50 poor rural villages around San Miguel de Allende. I am delighted to share our accomplishments in 2022.

Make no mistake, without the generous support from our many donors, both individual and foundational, Mujeres en Cambio can not exist. Overhead expenses at less than 3% means ninety-seven cents of every dollar received goes directly to the girls. Your assistance radically changes these young people's lives. More money means we can assist more girls. Thank you for helping us continue this worthwhile project.

#### LACEWING FOUNDATION

At Mujeres en Cambio we are firmly focused on our mission of helping our girls and young women overcome economic and cultural barriers to stay in school. We strive for long term sustainability for our organization to achieve that mission. In the 2022 year just passed we count the following among our most important accomplishments

#### Grantors

The **Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of SMA** continues to be one of our longest running grantors providing funding for 15 to 20 girls annually. **Lacewing Foundation**, another longstanding grantor, is tapering off their support by next year, due to a corporate decision to pursue other priorities. We were pleased that **Rapidan Foundation**, after several years absence, awarded us a grant which we hope to repeat in 2023. We also applied for and received a 60,000 peso grant from the local **Hiking Group of SMA**. We are applying to a few more international organizations, but the outcome is uncertain. We are fortunate to have a new volunteer to help us research new funding sources from Mexican based institutions.

### **Funds Raised**

On the fundraising front, as mentioned in the President's report above, we returned to a more normal year with income from all sources of \$1,355,973 pesos.

## ACCOMPLISHMENTS

We added 6 more girls to our program raising our total intake at the grade 8 equivalent level (secundaria 2) to 27 for the 2022/23 school year. This intake is designed to use up, over a 10-year period, the bulk of the windfall revenue generated in 2021 as mentioned in the Presidents' Report above.

We increased by 7% the value of scholarships to help mitigate current inflationary pressures. This is the first increase in seven years and works out to annual scholarship assistance of 6000 pesos (about \$300 USD) for junior and senior high school students and 26500 pesos (\$1325 USD) for university students.

## 3%

We have managed to keep our overhead very low at roughly 3% which means that most of our funds go directly into the pockets of the girls and young women in our program.

## \$7K

The year culminated with our first in-person event in the form of a fundraising luncheon that was a great success and ended up netting close to \$7000 USD.

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

In 2021/22, Mujeres en Cambio granted scholarships in the amount of 2,056,400 pesos (100,000 USD) delivered into these rural villages. This helped 43 students at the *Secundaria* (junior high) level; 61 at the *preparatoria* level (high school); and 59 at university including 2 girls who were helped with their *titulas* (professional certifications). # **70%**

We formally established a reserve of 70% of our annual expenses. This reserve is designed to handle the commitments we have in the event of a major catastrophe. We have carried a reserve of roughly this size in the past. The Board has now formalized the reserve level. We will invest any surplus funds in conservative term deposits until such time as they are needed.

# **STUDENT & DONOR SUPPORT**

#### SUPPORT A STUDENT

We began offering donors the opportunity to support and follow specific girls as they pursue their educational dreams and move through our 10-year assistance program. This is something numerous donors have requested in recent years, and we believe it will appeal to existing and new donors alike.

#### **STUDENT SEMINARS**

We have restarted student seminars at several distributions with the intent to enhance their information about career choices as well as socioemotional and life skills.

#### AMISTAD CANADA

Our partnership with Amistad Canada continued to bear fruit with an expanded donor base in Canada. We provided on-going progress reports to Amistad to satisfy our partnership agreement with them.



#### **ONLINE EVENTS**

We held virtual events that raised over \$915 USD. These included YouTube and Zoom presentations from well-known local personalities from San Miguel on a variety of interesting subjects.

### 2022's FINANCIALS

Note that we returned to a more normal fundraising compared to 2021. The Board approved implementation of a policy which will require us to keep roughly 70 percent of our annual budget in reserve. We believe this reserve will get us through potential catastrophes thus relieving the stress of budgeting experienced in previous years. We rely entirely on donations and grants for our revenue. **70%** annual budget held in reserve
